We will also have a new judging / scoring system. Lynda reinvented the wheel and judging is going to be done by using only cellphones and her laptop. She created a tool in Google Forms to capture and tabulate results from judging. This is foolproof and instantaneous. We have tested this new system and it has worked flawlessly.



Other new classes being considered are performance and survivor.

The location and date of the 2019 Car Show will be Hobo's in Old Town St. Peters; Saturday, May 18<sup>th</sup>. Our show will always fall on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday in May which is Armed Forces Day.

We had 100 entries in 2018 and Orville thinks we are going to grow again this year. With the anticipation of a larger show in 2019, we are going to do what we can to accommodate all the cars. Noel Wilson is assisting with layout of show location. Jeff Schweikert is taking the lead on; t-shirts, public relations / advertising / social. Jeff volunteered for taking the lead on promoting the Car Show on Social Media.


