 - This is about 9 miles North on Hwy 94 from Fastlane Classic Cars at I-370 & Hwy-94 turn left on Grafton Ferry Rd (airport sign is present) and airport is on right.
- Autocross committee is **actively** seeking a person or group of people to do cooking and handle food sales during both days of the autocross.
- Site has indoor restrooms for sanitation, great location for cooking and sales, large indoor area if needed due to rain.
