NCCC Stuff: (Tom Reitz)

- Upcoming Low Speed (Autocross) events:
 - July 9-10th is 14 low speeds in Lincoln, NE.,
 - July 16-17th is 14 low speeds in Madison, IL.,
 - July 23-24th is 14 low speeds in Quincy, IL. at John Wood Community College,
 - August 6-7th is 14 low speeds in Crystal Lake, IL.,
 - August 13-14th is 14 low speeds in Grissom, IN.,
 - August 20-21st is 14 low speeds at Madison, WI.
- NCCC Elections: Tom is once again on the nominating committee for NCCC elections this fall. He is looking for a Regional Competition Director to replace Jeff Craig, and likely a Regional Membership Director, and a Regional Treasurer (but I think Russ Tharp is running again). National is in need of a President, Vice President of Membership, a Treasurer (to replace Chris Reitz), a Parliamentarian, and a Director of Public Relations. All of these job descriptions can be found on the NCCC website. See me if you are interested in any of the positions. Remember, this is a 100% volunteer organization. Nobody gets paid.

Trailer Committee: (Tom Reitz)

Our storage lot for the trailer has been sold, originally it was Keeven Brothers Storage, which owns about 10 locations around the county, and now it is owned by "South 79 Boat & RV Storage" which is actually "SRC Autobody" which owns the autobody shop adjacent to the lot. They intend to keep the same price structure and we still have our spot. It should be a seamless transfer of ownership. The only difference will be who Rich makes the check out to in August.



Did You Know??

- The only parts of the 1953 Corvettes that were originally created for the new car was the fiberglass body. The rest of the parts were already made-with Chevrolet parts!
- The most units of Corvettes were sold in 1979, with 53,807 Corvettes created that year!
- For 11 years, the convertible top on Corvettes was on a hiatus, until it was reintroduced in 1986. It was an extra \$6,000 for the convertible. Included was also an Indy 500 plaque, after the 1986 yellow Corvette pace car at the Indy 500.
- The Head-Up display was first introduced in 1998. The RPM, oil pressure, and speed gauge were displayed in the windshield!
