AUTOCROSS: (Tom Reitz)

• The autocross committee has been following trends in autocross attendance across the Midwest Region of NCCC the past two years, and trends are in a negative direction. Most recent was May 21-22nd 14 events at TireRack in South Bend, Indiana. This event normally draws 60+ entrants yet this year had 31. Last weekend over a three-day Memorial Day "Midwest Region fundraiser" 21 event weekend in Rantoul, IL, we had 24 on Saturday, 28 on Sunday, and 22 on Monday at an event that normally draws 60+ entrants. (There were 40 entrants there last year).

Our event last year in 2021 had 24 entrants.

I believe gas prices are a large factor in this, COVID did not help, and the overall aging of the NCCC membership has reduced attendance at events as NCCC as a whole is sliding towards a more "social" type atmosphere with less emphasis on competitive events. These trends are well displayed in our own club over the past 15 years.

Therefore, I think it's time to pull the plug and cancel the annual autocross for the foreseeable future. It is an event requiring massive amounts of work over a two-day event by many people and the reward will be small with a current estimate of 20 entrants.

Our efforts will be better served on things like an annual club picnic (last years was awesome!) as well as fantastic road runs and events put on by our social committee, many thanks to Bob Isermann and his group.

No expenses have been put towards the autocross this year, so no loss to club. Airport is fine if we cancel.

I can / will let the general membership know at the club meeting this Thursday during the governor's report.

There was discussion about the track day at NCM. This is a wonderful opportunity to enjoy your car or a rental on a real track. He encouraged anyone who has not experienced this opportunity to try it out. You can go the NCM website and check their track day schedules.

Tom Reitz also discussed since there will not be any Autocross this year perhaps we could schedule a Poker Run. There were many people that raised their hands when asked if they would be interested in this event.

219 years ago:

 On April 30, 1803, American negotiators in Paris signed three separate legal instruments with France that together, transferred to the US all French claims to the Louisiana Territory. In an instant, America doubled in size.

President Thomas Jefferson, the farmer and scientist, obtained a Congressional appropriation to finance an expedition to the new lands.

He appointed his personal secretary, Meriwether Lewis, as the expedition commander, and together with William Clark, Lewis's friend and former Army commander, the forty-five person "Corps of Volunteers for Northwest Discovery" departed from St. Louis one year after the Purchase documents were signed.

Did You Know??

- 10 Corvette Concept Cars
- When the first Corvettes were created in 1953, only VIPs were able to purchase them. This included mayors, governors, and celebrities. Not a single Chevrolet dealership in 1953 received a Corvette, yet the rich elites were not interested, and many of the Corvettes never sold. This threatened the continuation of production of the vehicle, and it was nearly discontinued.
- Hours before the Motorama NYC show in January 1953, the Corvette logo had to be changed. The original logo was a checkered flag and an American flag, but the designer learned that it was illegal to have an American flag on commercial products. The American flag was changed to a French Fleur-de-lis, a reflection of the French etymology of the Chevrolet name!
