- The service department is busy. It takes 3-4 weeks to get an oil change. Delays are not due too much to parts shortages. Just busy.

- Club members get 10% off on parts and labor at their shop.

Governor's Report: NCCC Report: (Tom Reitz)

- NCCC Regional and National Governors meetings are November 11-12th at Westport
 Plaza. Competition events move to Florida and locations in the south for the rest of year.
 NCCC membership cards will come by February, you were emailed an electronic copy
 when your renewal was processed.
- The 2023 NCCC Convention will be held June 24 to 30, 2023. A link is posted on our website, registration opens February 1st at 9:00a.m. Early registration ensures you will be in host hotel. You really need to start thinking about attending NOW! We are staffing the "People's Choice" car show on Monday June 26th morning at the NCM parking lot. If you do not wish to register for the entire convention you CAN register for a "day pass" which you will need to attend and help at the People's Choice Car Show. Day passes do not go on sale until March 2023. The "tentative" registration cost for the entire convention is \$185 early, \$200 late and \$225, all "per person", at the event. Day pass prices vary depending on what meals are being provided that day but are around \$40 / day. The host hotel is the Holiday Inn Convention Center Bowling Green and is \$108 / night and includes a full breakfast for two per room each day.
- Rally Wrap-Up Update
 - 19 cars participated. There was a \$490 profit.
 - Oct 7-8 is held for us at NCCC for an event next year. On that date we will still have the high school parade to contend with. Sept 23 is open on the Club calendar next year to avoid the parade. (September trip will start on September 10 and will be back before Sept 23.)
 - A discussion was held at the meeting regarding the event options. A consensus was reached to combine the rally with the picnic.

 - Member consensus is to hold a rally on the same day as the picnic, prior to the start of the picnic.


