My Corvette Story

In 1961 I bought my first Corvette, a 1954 blue with a white top. After the first year of driving it, some friends and I pulled the motor. We had it bored 30 over with new rings and pistons and also had the heads renewed.



We also put in a 3 speed transmission that knocked off 2 1/2 seconds in the quarter mile. Then I did a little body work, shaved off the emblems and took off the bumper and license plate holder, also a repaint with a light 1951 Cadillac blue called Pelham blue. I found a hard top and bought it for \$100.00. That made the car! In 1962 Mickey Thompson made a mag wheel for the street, I had to have it, it cost me two weeks pay! The next 4 years I had a love affair with that car, then BAM! a real love affair. I got married, sold the car, started a family and I am still married today for 57 years.

In 1979 I got a promotion at work and I now had a little extra money. I wanted another Corvette. I found a 1974 T-top 4 speed for \$6000.00 in very good shape. maroon Corvette convertible and I'm looking good, but the downside was that it was an automatic, no third pedal.

I retired in 1999 and in 2020 I thought about a C8, but they only came with an automatic transmission. I missed that 1974 4 speed. 20 years with one car was enough, so I started looking, my grandson found my new dream, a 2018 Grand Sport, Admiral Blue over black, wow what a dream.



That lady I married in 1966 gave me a nod and I broke the piggy bank. I came full circle, a blue Corvette with a manual 7 speed transmission. I sold the 1988 for what I paid for it, \$10,000.00.
