## Biography of Mike Dixon, the Speaker for Our February 2025 Membership Meeting:

Mike Dixon will tell us about some of his experiences that happened during the reign of the Chevrolet Corvette. For almost 30 years the city of St. Louis, Missouri had the privilege of being its birthplace, except for the 300 made in Flint, Michigan, while the plant in St. Louis was being readied.

Mike started working at the St. Louis Corvette Assembly Plant on October 3rd, 1969. He didn't know it at the time, or even at the end of his tenure there, which lasted 18 years, that the period of his existence there would have the impact on his life that it has. And he had never read any stories told from the men who worked on the lines there in very adverse conditions that you will soon hear about.

Mike's first night at the plant watching his soon to be good friend shift through all four gears on a set of rollers at a speed of 80 miles an hour had quite the impact on him. He has said "That scent of exhaust, gasoline and smoking tires was better than any expensive French perfume I've ever had the privilege to encounter."

Mike is currently the caretaker of five. He says of the Corvette: "It's in my blood, some people would call it a disease, and if that's the case I'm as terminal as anyone can get and I'm not looking to get well anytime soon."

Mike says: "I feel the need to tell my story about the days 6500 days and or nights that I spent being a part of building the world's greatest sports car."

  - Club members David and Patti Hall have been serving 62 youngsters each weekend and now will be serving 72 each weekend as another school sent a request for help.

Patty and Elis Fitzwalter are here tonight representing their charity Heroin Education and Awareness League (HEAL) Stop Heroin to give us an overview of the organization.

- Elis thanked us for our donation back in March. Their son died from a heroin overdose. So, he and his wife Patty started the organization to have a conversation about the issue and to help find solutions and erase the stigma of substance abuse. 70% to 80% of addiction comes from improper use of prescription drugs. So lock up your medications. They have locking medication bags tonight. Dispose of expired or unused medications. Narcan is available to reverse opioid overdoses – available for free at many libraries and other places. Test kits are available to make sure a user's heroin is OK to use. Fake pills are all over and often have enough Fentanyl in them to kill you. Recovery programs are available. Check out the bags and other items after the meeting.
