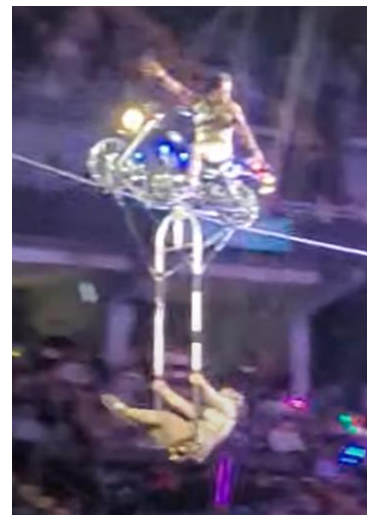
- There will be a complimentary bar and food available in the middle of the tent (I am sure you can find your way!).

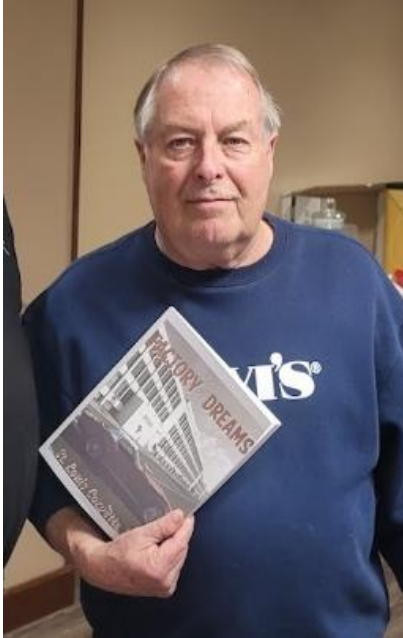

Introduction of Guest SPEAKER - Mike Dixon

Mike started his talk by describing his first day of work at the St. Louis Corvette assembly plant. He walked into the employment office in 1969 and asked about a job. He started working there that afternoon. Jobs were plentiful then! He worked in the Corvette plant for 18 years until it closed. He explained that he worked for "Corvette" until the plant closed, then for "GM" in Wentzville until he left there to start his heating and AC business in Granite City.



One of the first jobs that Mike had at the plant was installing the vacuum operated wiper door. He had 8 ½ minutes to install the vacuum motor, hoses, door and sealant before he had to crawl out of the engine bay to get to the next car coming down the line.

Mike told more stories and answered many questions from attendees. We learned that the plant ran at about 7 cars per hour, much slower than other car assembly lines. Mike reminded members that many more stories are included in his book.

I was watching the Mecum Kissimmee Auction on Thursday January 16th and saw a discussion of the Kammback tail on the Porsche 917K. I thought it to be interesting that the flat back design is almost as aerodynamic as the boat tail designs originally created to be “aerodynamic” many years earlier. The Kammback saved a lot of weight and length with very little loss of efficiency. Many, many cars used the Kammback shape, including C3 Corvettes. Oh, this 917K, owned by Jerry Seinfeld, did not sell. The bid was at \$26M. DS
