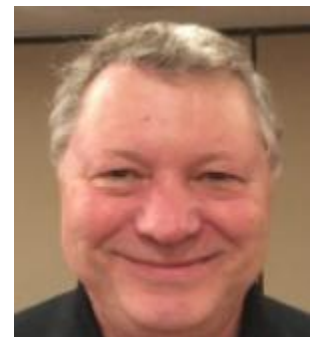

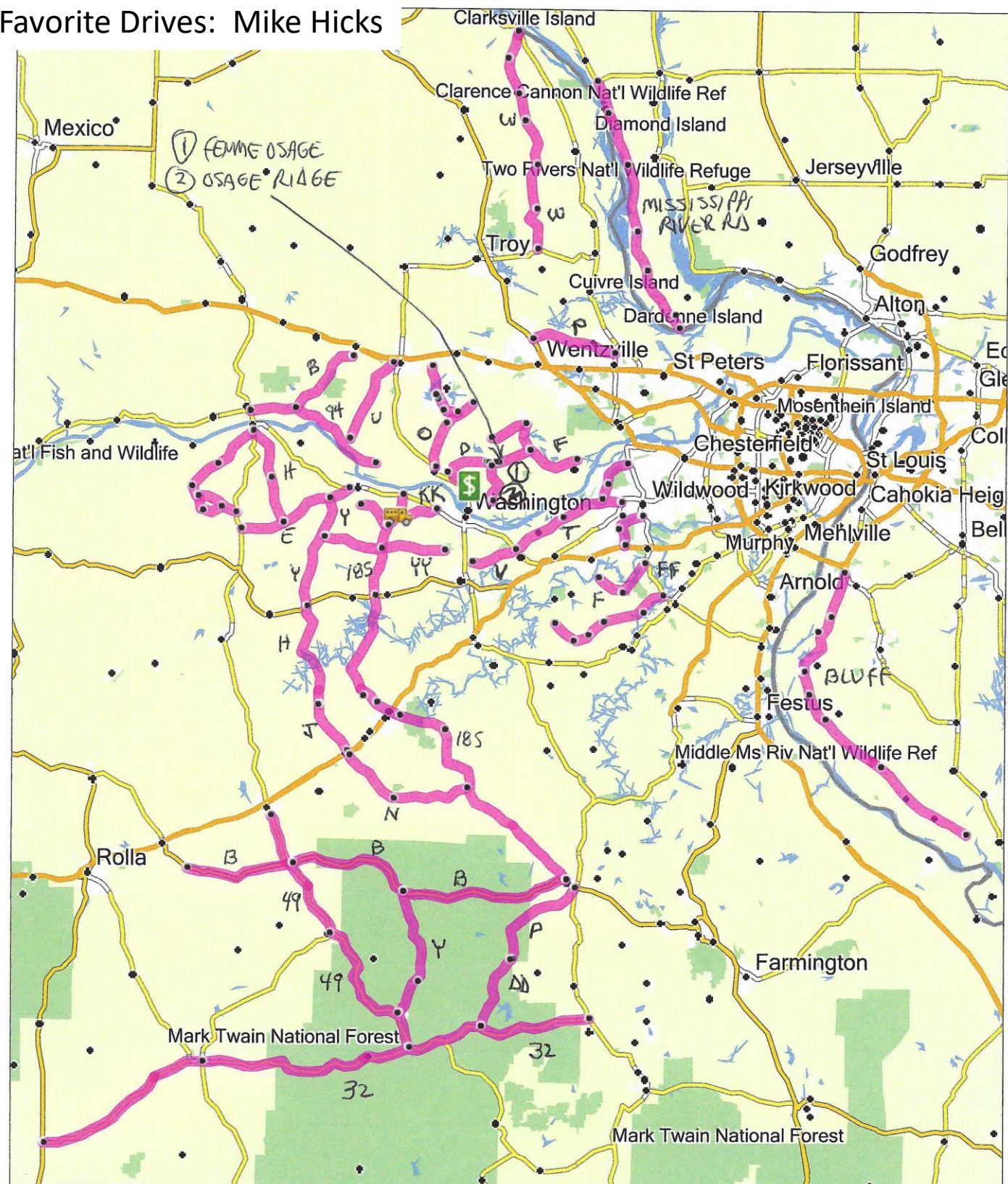

  - Wade Ramponi: His '79 C3 has been in the shop for many months to get the steering gear replaced. It sat for 1.5 years at one shop that never touched it. And It has been at a different shop for 2 months with no activity.
  - Doug Stone: His '77 C3 had been in the shop for 2 months to get the dash lights, door locks and windows working. The shop also found and replaced the control struts in the rear suspension. The time was complicated with waiting for parts and for the mechanic to heal after breaking his foot racing his son on a 20" Spyder bike!
  - Mike Bratton: His '24 C8 has been in the shop since mid November when it was hit from behind, damaging both the back and front, as he was driving his 1,200-mile car to the club road run to the Ulysses S. Grant Home.

## Biography of Mike Dixon, the Speaker for Our February 2025 Membership Meeting:

Mike Dixon will tell us about some of his experiences that happened during the reign of the Chevrolet Corvette. For almost 30 years the city of St. Louis, Missouri had the privilege of being its birthplace, except for the 300 made in Flint, Michigan, while the plant in St. Louis was being readied.

Mike started working at the St. Louis Corvette Assembly Plant on October 3rd, 1969. He didn't know it at the time, or even at the end of his tenure there, which lasted 18 years, that the period of his existence there would have the impact on his life that it has. And he had never read any stories told from the men who worked on the lines there in very adverse conditions that you will soon hear about.

Mike's first night at the plant watching his soon to be good friend shift through all four gears on a set of rollers at a speed of 80 miles an hour had quite the impact on him. He has said "That scent of exhaust, gasoline and smoking tires was better than any expensive French perfume I've ever had the privilege to encounter."

Mike is currently the caretaker of five. He says of the Corvette: "It's in my blood, some people would call it a disease, and if that's the case I'm as terminal as anyone can get and I'm not looking to get well anytime soon."

Mike says: "I feel the need to tell my story about the days 6500 days and or nights that I spent being a part of building the world's greatest sports car."
